Not sure what you need to do? Review the application checklist. The application status page Student who has run up the admission to AU and indicated an interest in the need-based financial support for their application has a financial support checklist on their application status page. This is the best place to find out what needs to be submitted and to check if we have received the materials. Detailed instructions on how to log in to the application status page have been sent to your student. All items are updated once a day. Anything with red x is still necessary. Please note that it may take a few days to update the checklist items during free/busy times (usually from November to February). Submitting documents The easiest and safest way to submit documents to our office is by uploading the process to your student's application status page. You can also email materials that can find@du.edu or send them to 303-871-2341. When reviewing the student support report Once you submit to the FAFSA, we recommend that you review the Student Support Report (SAR) to make sure it is correct and complete. The SAR will provide you with basic information about your eligibility for federal student support, as well as a list of your answers to

questions about the FAFSA. You will receive an email with instructions on how to access SAR online 3-5 days after you submit to FAFSA. If you don't have any changes to make the information specified in the SAR, just save it to your records. If found a mistake, you should correct or update your FAFSA. Reviewing your profile ConfirmationFrom as you submit a CSS profile, the College Board will give you a Profile Approval that will include all the information provided about the application. Unfortunately, you can't change the data on the CSS profile online. If you find an error, please print out a profile confirmation, make corrections directly to this form, and submit a paper version to our office. Federal Screening and Conflicting InformationSome students will be selected for a process called federal screening or there will be conflicting information between the FAFSA and CSS profile, which means we will need to collect additional documentation before we can create an assignment package. We will send email reminders to students who lack financial support requirements. However, as checklists may change, it is recommended that your student logs on to the application status page frequently. When to wait for the prize letter What exactly is the award letter? A letter of granting financial support (sometimes called a financial aid package) is a document that lists all types of financial support (or awards) your student is entitled to from the University of Denver. support can be obtained from federal, state or institutional sources. What do we need to do to receive the letter of assignment? To receive the award letter, your student is enrolled at the University of Denver and has a complete financial support file. This means that the 2019-2020 FAFSA, CSS profile (if you want it to be considered institutional, needs-based support) and all the additional documents requested have been submitted. When do we get it? The answer to this question depends on which round of admission applications your student chose and if you applied for financial support by the priority deadline. Early decision I applicants: if the application for financial aid is completed by 15 November, an award letter will be sent at the beginning of December with a decision on admission. Early action applicants: if the application for financial support was completed on 15 November, the grant letter will be sent shortly after the decision to admit it in mid-December. Early decision II applicants: if the application for financial aid is completed by 1 February, an award letter will be sent at the end of February with a decision on admission. Regular decision-making: If the application for financial support is completed by 1 February, the grant letter shall be sent shortly after the decision to adopt at the beginning of March. If you miss the priority deadline, that's OK! We will continue to send award letters each week to students who complete the process of requesting financial support after the above dates. How will we be notified? First, your student receives an email when the rewards letter is available for online viewing through the application status page. We mailed a follow-up package that includes additional information and resources to help you understand the financial support options for THE DU. How are prizes determined? The types of support listed in your student grant letter are based on a number of things, including information your family provides on your FAFSA and CSS profile and your student's planned enrollment. We will provide much more information on this topic in the future Financial Support 101 email. Anything else I need to know? Many of the financial support package prizes will be offered to your student—they will not be automatically accepted on his or her behalf. This means, for example, that students who do not want to borrow the loan they were offered are not obliged to accept this loan. Some types of financial support will also require additional measures before funding can be obtained. In addition, please note that, according to the policy of the University of Denver, we cannot agree on financial support packages.
